"Military families often have legitimate connections to three or four different states simultaneously, which makes determining the appropriate forum for divorce proceedings particularly challenging," said Jay Henderlite, Board Certified Marital & Family Law Expert and managing partner at Sasso Guerrero & Henderlite. "The state where a divorce is filed can significantly impact custody arrangements, support calculations, and property division, making jurisdiction one of the most critical initial decisions in these cases."

State residency requirements vary considerably across the nation, with some states requiring six months of continuous presence while others mandate only 90 days. Military service members benefit from certain protections under the Servicemembers Civil Relief Act, which can affect procedural timelines, but these protections add another layer of complexity to jurisdictional determinations.

The firm notes that custody and parenting plan decisions face additional complications when parents maintain residency in different states. Interstate custody disputes involve the Uniform Child Custody Jurisdiction and Enforcement Act, which establishes protocols for determining which state has authority over custody matters. For military families, frequent relocations can trigger ongoing jurisdictional questions even after initial custody orders are established.

Property division and support calculations also vary significantly between states, making the choice of jurisdiction a strategic consideration with long-term financial implications. Some states follow community property principles while others apply equitable distribution standards, leading to potentially different outcomes for the same military family depending on where proceedings occur.

The intersection of federal military benefits and state divorce law creates unique challenges requiring military divorce guidance from attorneys familiar with both systems. Understanding how different states treat military retirement under the Uniformed Services Former Spouses' Protection Act, disability benefits, and other service-connected entitlements becomes essential for informed decision-making.
